UNOPPOSED MOTION TO DISMISS APPEAL

Under Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 42(b), defendants-appellants the North Carolina State Board of Elections, Damon Circosta, Stella Anderson, Jeff Carmon III, and Karen Brinson Bell move to dismiss their appeal of the district court’s temporary restraining order. *See* F. R. App. P 42(b) (providing that an “appeal may be dismissed on the appellant’s motion on terms . . . fixed by the court”). Below, the district court denied plaintiffs’ motion to convert the temporary restraining order into a preliminary injunction, making this appeal moot. *See Wise v. N.C. State Bd. of Elections*, No. 1:20-cv-912, Doc. No. 56 (M.D.N.C. Oct. 14, 2020).
