IMO (in the matter of) Non-Conformities Between Published Sample Ballots and Voting Machine Interface Ballots and Informalities and Omissions in Voter Instruction Cards.

Introduction

1. The complainant, Lee Thomason, (hereinafter "Thomason"),

is a citizen, resident and registered voter in the Commonwealth of

Kentucky.

2. Respondents are the County Clerks of the counties in Kentucky, (listed at Tab 1), who are obligated by federal and state law to publish "sample" ballots, and provide election day "information" and "instruction cards" on voting systems and procedures.

3. Respondents additionally are County Attorneys of the counties of Kentucky (listed at Tab 5), which state law obligates to "prepare" "instruction cards," *e.g.*, K.R.S. §117.175, on voting information, systems and procedures, consistent with Title III of the Help America Vote Act of 2002, *e.g.*, 31 KAR §6.010, §3(2)(a), containing, *inter alia*, "instructions as to the proper method of voting by the use of the voting equipment, and instructions as to the proper method of casting a write-in vote."

4. Complainant Thomason does not fault the Respondent County Clerks who publish the statutorily-mandated sample ballots, instruction cards, and who oversee the voting systems, and also does not criticize the work of election officials and public servants, and this complaint is not a criticism of the election oversight efforts of the Respondent County Attorneys. The complaint seeks remedies that reduce the potential for voter confusion, mistaken votes and that promote better informed voters and clearer instructions on voting and voting systems.

5. As a resident and registered voter in Kentucky, Complainant Thomason has standing to plead this complaint for the relief requested.

6. In addition, Thomason has standing to seek relief because Thomason meets all the constitutional and statutory requirements to declare as a write-in candidate in the November 2022 General Election. KRS §117.265. Thomason has taken steps to declare as a write-in candidate for the November 2022 election. The statutory time to file a Declaration of Intent to be a Write-In Candidate is open until October, 2022.

JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD

7. KRS 117.015(1)(a) authorizes the Kentucky State Board of Elections to promulgate administrative regulations necessary to properly carry out its duties in the administration of the election laws, in particular, complaint and resolution procedures to address problems with ballots and voting systems.

8. The federal Help America Vote Act of 2002, 52 U.S. Code § 21112, requires the establishment of a state-based administrative complaint procedure to remedy grievances in elections for federal offices.

9. In Kentucky, 31 KAR 6:010 establishes an administrative complaint procedure to consider and to remedy grievances in voting, ballots and elections for federal offices.

10. In this complaint, Thomason alleges violations of the requirements that Title III of the Help America Vote Act places upon state's election officials and the elections for federal offices in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, specifically, violations of:

A. Standards for voting systems;

B. Requirements for provisional voting and voting information.

Note: 52 U.S.C.A. § 21081(b)(1) & (2) broadly defines "voting systems."

11. The remedies contemplated in Title III of the Help America Vote Act address the "requirements" on the states for its "voting systems," which "systems" encompass all of "(2) the practices and associated documentation used— ... (E) to make available any materials to the voter (such as notices, instructions, forms, or paper ballots)." 52 U.S.C.A. § 21081(b)(2)(E).

12. Title III and the "materials" made available "to the voter" which include all "notices, instructions, forms, or paper ballots" that comprise "voting systems" used in this state extend to the sample ballots, instruction cards, and ballots¹ to which the election laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky apply.

¹ According to Kentucky statute, any "ballot" or the "official ballot" means the "official presentation of offices and candidates to be voted for, including write-in candidates, and all public questions submitted for determination and shall include a voting machine ballot, a paper ballot, an absentee ballot, a special ballot, a federal provisional ballot, a federal provisional absentee ballot, or a supplemental paper ballot which has been authorized for the use of the

13. Complainant Thomason seeks the remedies recommended in the federal statutes which remedies should provide improvements of the sample ballots, instruction cards and related aspects of the "voting systems" and voting procedures that Title III of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 governs, so as to guarantee that voters receive adequate notice, comprehensive voting instructions, and information about their choice and voting options that are fully consistent with the laws and statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and federal law.

14. To a degree the complaint urges changes to sample ballots and voting instructions, *i.e.*, changes to those that take account of the intent of the federal Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act, recognizing that "It is the intention of Congress in enacting this chapter to promote the fundamental right to vote by improving access for handicapped and elderly individuals [*defined as age 65 or older*] to registration facilities and polling places for Federal elections." 52 U.S. Code §§ 20101 - 20107.

voters in any primary or regular or special election by the Secretary of State or the county clerk" K. R. S. § 120.005.

<u>Sample Ballots Must Notify Voters about the form and content of the Actual</u> <u>Ballot, Inform Voters of Their Choice of Candidates, and Instruct Voters on</u>

How to Cast Their Votes Accurately and Acceptably.

15. This complaint seeks to remedy, before the General Election in November 2022, the unfair practice of publishing "sample ballots" that do not conform in format or appearance to the actual ballot and the appearance of that official on the scan-in sheets and screens that voters will be faced with when they go to the polls and use the voting machine systems approved in their counties.

16. General and specific references are made in this Complaint to the list of voting machine systems approved for use in the various counties of Kentucky, which are listed at Tab 2, and to the collected examples of sample ballots published in 2022 by County Clerks, attached at Tab 3, hereto.

17. Further, Complainant Thomason seeks to remedy, before the General Election in November 2022, the unfair practice of using nonstandardized voter "instruction cards," and cards that the County Clerks and County Attorneys did not "prepare," using voter "instruction cards" published by the companies that make and sell voting machines, and cards that do not contain "instructions as to the proper method of casting a write-in vote," and

as importantly, to remedy the occasional practice of not providing to voters or not posting prominently at the polling places, voter "instruction cards containing instructions as to the proper method of voting by the use of the voting equipment, and instructions as to the proper method of casting a write-in vote." *Id*.

<u>Requirements to Prepare, Publish and Post Sample Ballots, Voters Instruction</u> <u>Cards and Voting System Information.</u>

18. The relevant provisions of 52 U.S.C.A. § 21082(b) requires that the "appropriate State or local election official" publish and publicly post at polling places "a sample version of the ballot" and "instructions on how to vote."

19. In Kentucky, state law places a similar obligation on County Clerks in K.R.S. §424.390, that is, that "before any …election the county clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper a copy of the ballots," and further, that this "copy" or sample ballot meets the statutory requirement that the copy encompass "all pertinent information that will appear, upon which the voters will cast their votes." 20. Kentucky statutory law defines a "ballot" or the "official ballot," upon which all the pertinent information is presented so as to comprise "the official presentation of offices and candidates to be voted for, including writein candidates, and ... shall include a voting machine ballot." K.R.S. §120.005.

21. Furthermore, Kentucky statutory law requires that each "county clerk shall, with the county attorney, prepare a sufficient number of instruction cards containing instructions as to the proper method of voting by the use of the voting equipment, and instructions as to the proper method of casting a write-in vote" and that each County's "election clerk shall post the instruction card at the polling place." KRS § 117.175.

22. The plain intent and expressed purposes of the foregoing federal and state statutes is to provide notice to voters of their choices and to inform voters about who is on the ballot, and to instruct voters on how properly to cast their votes on the voting equipment systems approved for use in their county and precinct.

23. Remedies are called for to address non-conformities in the sample and official ballots, or the inadequacies of or a lack of prominently posted voter "instruction cards," both of which the statutes require, that if not remedied likely will result in mis-votes, no-votes, and similar problems due to failures to notify, inform, educate and instruct votes of all ages and capabilities how properly to vote in the November 2022 General Election.

24. The relief requested here is to ensure that those purposes and the requirements of those statutes are fully implemented. Sample ballots that do not provide notice and do not conform with the form of ballots, which are presented to voters at their polling places, must be remedied.

25. "Other voting methods, including electronic machines, have a very different user interface than written questionnaires and paper-based ballots." Kimball, David C., and Martha Kropf. *Ballot design and unrecorded votes on paper-based ballots*, at pg. 511, *Public opinion quarterly* 69, no. 4 (Jan. 1, 2005): 508-529. "Given the growing popularity of electronic [voting] machines in the United States, it is important that the interface and layout are easy for voters to comprehend. *Id.*, at 527.

26. Publishing a "sample" ballot that does not conform to the actual ballot as shown or presented on the electronic voting systems, are practices that violate the letter and spirit of §6 of the Constitution of Kentucky, state laws of this Commonwealth, and the federal Help America Vote Act of 2002, as set out in more detail herein.

27. Consider the layout and appearance differences between several sample ballots, and then consider how those several samples differ from the user interface versions of the ballot that is presented on whichever of the electronic voting machine systems are approved for a particular county.

28. Consider the recent sample ballots for Laurel County and Floyd County.



SAMPLE BALLOT

29. Notice that the recent sample ballot from Laurel County includes basic "Instructions To Voters," but the Floyd County sample does not, even though both counties use the same Election Systems & Software (ES&S) electronic voting machines. (excerpts from 2022 sample ballots below, and larger images of entire samples at Tab 3).

30. The sample ballots from counties approved to use the Hart Intercivic electronic voting machines do not include any instructions on voting.



31. The above examples are excerpts from the samples published in Bullitt County and Campbell County for the recent primary election (full samples at Tab 3, and list of approved voting machines by county at Tab 2).

32. A further point of comparison is that, although the electronic voting equipment systems and voting procedures in Kentucky have changed over the past 20 years, while not much has changed in terms of the format and appearance of sample ballots used today.

33. That same sort of comparison can focus on the voter "instruction cards," some of which have not changed in twenty years. (Note the revision date of "REV 07/02" on one instruction card provided in response to an Open Public Records Request, at Tab 4 hereto). Not that KRS § 117.175 on the requirement for instruction cards has been amended twice since 2002.

34. The variations between the sample ballots from various counties and how those differ from the actual scannable or electronic touchscreen ballots leads to the conclusion that in some counties voters are provided more information and in other counties less information is provided to voters when they see the published or posted sample ballots, if they see one at all.

35. In the past twenty years many changes have been made to the approved electronic voting machines in Kentucky, and many changes have been made to the Kentucky statutes that govern voting, voting systems and voting procedures. While the appearance and format of the actual ballot used on electronic voting machines has varied and changed over those twenty years, the format and appearance of the sample ballots has stayed nearly the same (although the undersigned does not have access to a complete set of samples from all Kentucky counties for primary and general elections).

36. Over twenty years ago, Jefferson County began using the Diebold "ACCUVOTE" electronic voting machines, which complainant understands had a user interface and voting protocol different from that presented to voters on the Election Systems & Software (ES&S) voting machine systems that Jefferson County now uses. Below is one image of the voting page interface on those "ACCUVOTE" terminals.



38. The "sample" ballots from the most recent primary election differ very little in appearance and layout from 1998 Jefferson County sample, despite all the changes in voting machine systems and the laws respecting voting in Kentucky. One noted difference is that the 1998 sample begins with some instructions on voting.

39. The practice of the Jefferson County Clerk to include some voting instructions on the sample ballot continued, as indicated on the image below from the 2002 sample ballot.



40. Compare that 2002 sample with the most recent samples from

several counties, collected at Tab 3, that include no instructions on voting.

41. Essentially, the legal requirements to prepare, publish and post a the sample ballot and any posted voting instructions and instruction cards serve to ensure that voters are prepared to make informed, educated choices about who should get their vote, and to instruct how to cast their votes correctly. A "ballot is a form that represents perhaps the most important interaction between a government and its citizens." *Better Ballots,* Quesenbery, W., Kimball, D., Norden, L., & Chen, M. (Brennan Center for Justice 2008) (accessible online at *https://www.brennancenter.org/our-work/research-reports/better-ballots*) ("a lack of consistency in ballot design or election materials like sample ballots should be a warning sign to election officials and concerned members of the public.").

42. KRS § 424.290 Requires that a "copy" of the ballot be published "showing all the pertinent information that will appear, upon which the voters will cast their votes at a particular polling place."

43. The laws respecting the preparation and publishing of a "sample" ballot that sets forth "all the pertinent information" should be interpreted to require that presentation of "all" that information on the sample "ballots" conform to the actual "ballot" which the voters see and are required to use,

and which the law defines as "the official presentation of offices and candidates to be voted for, including write-in candidates." K.R.S. § 120.005 (1)

44. Before the 2022 primary election, Thomason attended an official training session for poll workers and reviewed all the printed instructional materials provided there. Posting a sample ballot never was mentioned. Using or posting the required voter instruction cards never was mentioned.

45. At the polling place where complainant voted in the May 2022 primary election, it was only <u>after</u> filling in my paper ballot did complainant see the sample ballot because it was posted above the optical scanner device on the electronic voting machines and that was the final station at the poll.

46. At the polling place where I voted in the May 2022 primary election, complainant did not see any "instruction cards containing instructions as to the proper method of voting" that are required by KRS § 117.175.

47. The undersigned complainant Thomason served several County Clerks offices with Public Records Requests for the "instruction cards" required by statute, and those that were produced are collected at Tab 4 hereto.

48. The importance of each voter's choice and how voters interact with visual information imposes an unbounded obligation on election authorities, that choose the design of the official printed and electronic ballots, to remedy differences between those <u>official</u> ballot designs, *i.e.*, layout, content and arrangement of visual and text instructions for users, navigation buttons, etc., and the "sample" ballots that are published and posted. *Reynolds* v. *Sims*, 377 U. S. 533, 555 (1964) ("The right to vote freely for the candidate of one's choice is of the essence of a democratic society, and any restrictions on that right strike at the heart of representative government").

49. Differences, non-conformities and omissions as between the official ballot, the printed "sample," the scannable paper version, and the user interface ballots on the electronic voting systems impact which candidates the voters decide to vote for, and even whether they cast a vote at all, and whether they vote accurately or not. "[P]oor ballot design and instructions have caused the loss of ... thousands of votes in nearly every election year." *Better Ballots*, Quesenbery, W., Kimball, D., Norden, L., & Chen, M. (Brennan Center for Justice 2008)(accessible online at

https://www.brennancenter.org/our-work/research-reports/better-ballots

50. Voters coming of age to vote for the first time, voters newly resident and newly registered to vote in Kentucky, the elderly and others are likely to be confused by the omissions and differences between the ballot image on the electronic voting machines, and the non-conforming "sample" ballots published and posted by the County Clerks.

51. The federal Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act requires each State and local government responsible for conducting elections to make voting aids for Federal elections available for handicapped and elderly (over age 65) voters.


52. State and federal statutory and constitutional laws guarantee that citizens of Kentucky have the right to vote in the general election for the candidate of their choice, which includes candidates from the two major political parties, as well as any candidates who timely have filed with the Secretary of State a declaration to be write-in candidate. KRS § 117.265.

53. "No right is more precious in a free country than that of having a voice in the election of those who make the laws under which, as good citizens, we must live. Other rights, even the most basic, are illusory if the right to vote is undermined." *Wesberry v. Sanders*, 376 U. S. 1, 17 (1964).

54. Compare the published sample ballots with how the user interface


electronic voting machines approved for use in: Floyd County, Kentucky.

56. The visual presentation of all pertinent information on the "ballot" that is the "sample" printed in the newspaper, the layout of the "absentee ballot," the "official" ballot (see full definition in K.R.S. § 120.005 (1)), and separate from the visual representation on the "voting machine ballot" on the Hart, ES&S, and Expressvote machines, and the "paper ballot" that a voter can request, do not conform one to the other.

57. The layout, format, content, and appearance of the information required to be on the ballots differs from county to county, and so voters in one county may be more informed and instructed than voters in another county.

58. Compare the voter "instruction cards," required by statute, collected at Tab 4 (provided in response to Thomason's Public Records requests to some County Clerks) that purport to instruct Kentucky voters in various counties on, to quote the statute, "the proper method of voting by the use of the voting equipment, and instructions as to the proper method of casting a write-in vote" on the ES&S and Hart voting machine systems that are approved for the voters to use to vote in their counties.

59. Voters in some counties may be provided with "instruction cards," which adequately include all the information set forth in KRS § 117.175. In other counties the instruction cards are non-existent, or not posted or available, or do not provide the information and instructions that the statute requires. The actual instruction cards obtained by Public Records requests are not uniform, and differ greatly in length, content, and separately have some more or much less of the information and instructions required by the statute.

60. The County clerks, aided by the county attorneys, did not "prepare" the voter "instruction cards," samples at Tab 4, consistent with the directive in the statute. Instead, the companies that make and sell the voting machine systems appear to have prepared those materials. These pages from

these companies' instruction manual, are pages that provide generic operating instructions that fall short of the content requirements in KRS § 117.175.

Thomason acknowledges that the statutory directive - "shall ... 61. prepare" - book-ends a split infinitive, and that the phrasing may be deemed ambiguous enough to provoke the question whether "prepare" pertains to the administrative or ministerial act of making a "sufficient number" of copies, or to the important official act of preparing the "instructions as to the proper method of voting by the use of the voting equipment, and instructions as to the proper method of casting a write-in vote," but may pertain to both an administrative and the official acts. KRS § 117.175 should be read to require that the County Clerk and the County Attorney actually "prepare" the voter "instruction cards containing" all the required information and instructions. This is consonant with the longstanding, "fundamental principle that the courts will construe election statutes liberally in favor of the citizens" right to be adequately instructed about the candidates and how "to choose their public officers". Queenan v. Mimms, 283 S.W.2d 380, 382 (Ky. 1955), accord KRS § 446.080 "All statutes of this state shall be liberally construed with a view to promote their objects and carry out the intent of the legislature."

63. Kentucky voters, who are registered and identified to the election officials, are qualified to vote for whoever they wish to be their elected representatives. That right is guaranteed by the Constitution of Kentucky. "Within the constitutional provision, [Ky. Const. § 6], emphasis may be laid upon the right of voters to select a candidate and have the unrestricted right to vote for any eligible person he may choose to vote for by writing that person's name upon the ballot in the blank space provided for that purpose." *McIntosh v. Helton*, 828 S.W.2d 364, 366 (Ky. 1992).

64. The laws governing elections in the Commonwealth require that all the electronic voting systems used in Kentucky counties "shall"... "Permit each voter to vote, in any regular or special election, for any person for whom the voter desires to vote whose name does not appear upon the ballot by providing a method of write-in voting." KRS §117.125(9).

65. The examples of voter "instruction cards" obtained using Public Records requests to county clerks indicate that some samples provide a lot less information and instructions than other examples, and that some provide no information about "the proper method of casting a write-in vote."

66. The guaranteed rights of Kentucky voters must not be impaired by (a) the use of "sample" ballots that do not conform to the official ballot shown on electronic voting systems, or (b) by the lack of adequate instruction cards, or at least (c) a box or space, that inform voters in Kentucky of their right "to choose to vote for [a declared candidate] by writing that person's name upon the ballot in the blank space provided for that purpose." *McIntosh, id*.

67. The legally-mandated and statutorily protected practice of Writein voting for a declared candidate serves as an important safety mechanism in those election cycles where late-developing issues arise, or where late in the race new information is disclosed about a candidate. It allows voters to rethink their support of candidates on the official ballot and to exercise their right to vote for a write-in candidate. The "right of qualified voters within a state to cast their ballots and have them counted at Congressional elections. ... is a right secured by the Constitution." *U.S. v. Classic*, 313 U.S. 299, 315 (1941).

68. Kentucky voters interact with visual information, on electronic voting systems, on sample ballots and on voter instruction cards, to exercise one of our most precious rights as American citizens - the right to choose who will govern them. "[T]he true principle of a republic is that the people should

choose whom they please to govern them. This great source of free government, popular election, should be perfectly pure, and the most unbounded liberty allowed." 2 <u>Debates on the Federal Constitution</u> 257 (J. Elliot ed. 1876).

69. Complainant Thomason pleads the foregoing violations of the federal and state laws that require, and certainly are intended to give voters notice of their voting choices, to inform voters about all the pertinent information that will be presented on the official ballot they see at their polling places, and that instruct Kentucky voters how to cast their votes intelligently and acceptably, and complainant Thomason requests the Board to provide appropriate and effective remedies.

WHEREFORE, the complainant Thomason prays for the following relief:

I. That before and during the November 2022 General Election that, with regard to the "voting systems" including provision of "materials to the voter," the "sample ballots," the "official" paper and electronic interface "ballots," and the voter "instruction cards," that the Board instruct the county clerks and election officials in the counties to prepare, publish, prominently post and make readily available the materials that comply with applicable federal and state statutes and assure that these materials fully provide notice to Kentucky voters, inform them of their choices when they go to vote, and

that instruct voters of all ages and educational levels how accurately and acceptably to cast their vote whether they vote on a scannable paper form of ballot, or a paper or absentee ballot, or on an electronic machine interface ballot, and that instruct voters how to cast a write-in vote;

II. For the Board to ascertain and address compliance statewide with the statutory requirements for "voting systems" including "materials to the voter," the "sample ballots," the "official" paper and electronic interface "ballots," and the voter "instruction cards," which the county clerks and local election officials must "prepare" before the November 2022 General Election;

III. That the Board propose administrative rules that instruct the county clerks about and that standardize conformance in appearance, content and layout as between the sample ballots and the "ballot" or "official ballot" defined in K.R.S. §120.005;

IV. That the Board propose administrative rules that instruct the county clerks and county attorneys how they must "prepare" the voter "instructions cards" that uniformly and adequately instruct voters in every Kentucky county "as to the proper method of voting by the use of the voting equipment," and that provide adequate "instructions as to the proper method of casting a write-in vote"; and,

V. All other declarative and curative relief that the Board deems appropriate and reasonable to address the matters asserted here.

Write-in votes shall be counted only for candidates for election to office who have filed a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate with the Secretary of State or county clerk, depending on the office being sought, on or before the fourth Friday in October preceding the date of the regular election and not later than the second Friday before the date of a special
